J. Christopher Lytle, Executive Director, Port of Long Beach

On November 12, 2011 Chris Lytle was named executive director for the Port of Long Beach. A shipping industry veteran, Mr. Lytle served as Deputy Executive Director and Chief Operations Officer from 2008 to 2011, reporting to former executive director Richard D. Steinke. He joined the Port in September 2006 as one of the four Managing Directors and he oversaw the Port's Trade Relations and Port Operations Bureau, which includes the Communications, Trade Development, Security and Maintenance Divisions. Before joining the Port, Mr. Lytle served as Vice President of West Coast Operations for the French-based shipping line CMA CGM, which has significant marine and terminals operations at the Port of Long Beach, Oakland and Seattle. Mr. Lytle has also held executive positions at P&O Ports North America, Denmark-based APM (Maersk) Terminals, and Sea-Land Services, Inc.

Geraldine Knatz, Ph.D, Executive Director, Port of Los Angeles

In 2006, Geraldine Knatz became the first female executive director of the Port of Los Angeles where she oversees the daily operations and internal management of the nation's number one container port. Under Knatz' leadership, the Port of L.A. plans to invest \$1.2 billion in capital improvements through 2015. As the global trade landscape continues to evolve, Knatz' team is focusing on solution-oriented approaches to meeting customer needs and expanding business opportunities through competitive operations, speed-to-market efficiency and outstanding customer service. Included in *Los Angeles* magazine's "Power List" of L.A. influentials, Dr. Knatz is President of the International Association of Ports and Harbors.
